Civil War Round Table of New Hampshire 15th Anniversary Celebration to Include Talk by Artist Jeff Fioravanti

Epping, NH (April 25, 2006) – In the month of May 2006, the Civil War Round Table (CWRT) of New Hampshire will celebrate the 15th anniversary of the founding of their organization. Included in the festivities, will be a typical New England potluck supper, followed by a talk about the inspiration behind some of his work, by historical landscape and preservation artist Jeff Fioravanti. Both the supper and the talk will occur during the groups regularly scheduled monthly meeting, which is slated for Friday, May 19th at 7:15 PM at the Epping Town Hall, in Epping, New Hampshire. The meeting and presentation is free and open to the public, and all are welcome.
